## Highlights Village of Fleischmanns Special Meeting June 24, 2020

The meeting was held by conference call and convened at 12:35.

- New appointments:
  - Jennifer Barrow will serve out the remainder of John Granito's term, extended as Village elections have been postponed.
  - Mr. Granito to fill an open seat of the Zoning Board of Appeals.
  - Yvon Luxana to fill the unexpired seat of Skene Memorial Library Board member Suzanna Margolis.
- Pool update- construction delayed due to Covid-19. The Village board approved the cost of the pool coating and a pool cover.
   Pool will not be open for summer 2020.
- Road projects
  - Lake Street: Paving delayed due to NYC/CWC stormwater funding delay.
  - Wagner Ave oil and stoning: TBD 2020 Town of Middletown schedule.
  - Ellsworth Avenue grading: TBD 2020 Town of Middletown schedule.
  - Breezy Hill: Reflectors to be installed. Guardrails/ paving not scheduled due to lack of funding.
- Clean energy initiatives:
  - Dan Halpren exploring a two-vehicle charging station.
- M-ark Project Kiosk:
  - Ben Fenton noted that the village has received a oneyear grant extension to June 2021. Response to RFP's expected July 9, 2020.

## It Happened in Fleischmanns



For the 2020 Fleischmanns Flyer, the Greater Fleischmanns Museum of Memories will highlight events that happened here over the past 11 decades. This month--the 60's & 70's.

Real Estate has always been a hot topic here in our mountains. The January 13, 1961 Catskill Mountain News re-

ported (on the front page) that the Bishop House in Fleischmanns had been sold. The new owners now in 2020 would be amused to learn that the selling price back then was a whopping \$16,000.

The New York Times ran an article on July 27, 1976 on the rash of fires in the Catskills; Fleischmanns had had a number of suspicious blazes, and was the dateline for the story.

Sold Bishop House

, Fleischmanns, Jan. 10. — Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Stitham have sold their home, Bishop house, to Mrs. Helena Konitzer of Seaford, L. I.

The Bishop house is a well known tourist home. Mr. and Mrs. Stitham and four children were well-liked in Fleischmanns

We are sorry to see them leave.
They are residing in Newburgh.
Mr. and Mrs. Konitzer will use
this home as their retirement

home, with income. We welcome our new neighbors. The purchase price of \$16,000

was paid in cash.

Long-time Fleischmanns residents Sol and Elizabeth Darling celebrated their 50th Anniversary in 1978.



In the late 60's and early 70's, Fleischmanns gained some popularity as a counter-culture refuge. Many passed through, but some put down roots here, and remain here still.

The last graduating class from Fleischmanns was

1968. The school was used for elementary-only for a few more years, but New York State was pushing for larger consolidated district schools, even though that required busing.

The last New York Central train (freight only for the final 22 years) left Fleischmanns October 6, 1976. It was the end of over 100 years of railroading here. (The photo is courtesy of John Ham.)

#### **Village Stores and Restaurants Re-open**

Delaware County has entered Phase 3 of the re-opening along with the rest of the Southern Tier.

All retail stores are open, restaurants are now able to serve customers both outdoors and indoors, at a reduced capacity with 6 foot distancing between tables.

- Goatie White's is open Wednesday Friday, 4-9pm and Saturday and Sunday, 12-9pm for indoor and outdoor dining.

- At all three restaurants masks are required until seated.
- Fleischmanns Supermarket, Monday-Saturday,
   7:30am-8pm, Sunday, 8am-7pm
- Sam's Country Store, 5:30am-8pm, and Sunday,6am-6pm for take-out and groceries
- Two Stones Farm. Is open Friday-Sunday, 1-4:30pm
- Tinderbox Stoves and Fireplaces, Tuesday-Saturday, 9-4pm

At retail stores masks are still recommended and staff at both stores and restaurants are required to wear masks. Wearing a mask is protection for you and those around you. It is important that we keep the Covid infection rate down. As of the writing of this piece, infection rate in NY State is under 2 percent. Wearing masks and being socially distant has achieved this result. Let's do everything we can to keep it that way.

## FLEISCHMANNS' MOUNTAIN ATHLETIC CLUB GROUNDS RECOMMENDED TO STATE & NATIONAL REGISTERS OF HISTORIC PLACES

WATERFORD, NY - Last week, the New York State Board for Historic Preservation recommended 28 sites for listing on the State and National Registers for Historic Places. Among them was the Mountain Athletic Club Grounds at Fleischmanns Park, where millionaire brothers Julius and Max Fleischmann built a state-of-the-art baseball park in 1895 and played alongside many future and former major league baseball players. The grounds were donated to the community in 1914 to be used as a park in perpetuity at which time the Village, formerly called Griffin Corners, was changed to Fleischmanns.

The M.A.C. Grounds joins three other sites in the Village of Fleischmanns that are listed on the historic register (Skene Memorial Library, Congreation B'Nai Israel Synagogue and Maxbilt Theater). However, it is the first listing to honor the community's connection to the Fleischmann family – founders of the Fleischmann's Yeast Company in Cincinnati, OH.

"We're over the moon about it!" stated Collin Miller, current organizer of the vintage baseball team fashioned after the original M.A.C. Since the Club was revived in 2007, the M.A.C. has played their home games on the historic ballfield in Fleischmanns. Miller started learning more about the origins of the Club and the famous men who played here with the help of many baseball historians and the historic preservation office over the last several months. "The more (information) we uncovered, the more I believed that our field warranted the special recognition," Miller added. "With our 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year, the timing was just right."

In a letter of support for the listing, the Town of Middletown Historian, Diane Galusha offered her appraisal of the site,

"The grandstand may be gone and cars have replaced the horse drawn buggies, but today's vintage baseball that attracts scores of fans to Fleischmanns Park can be traced directly to the Fleischmann family that brought America's game to this classic Catskill Mountain Village in 1895."

Miller says the next phase of the process includes a forwarding of the nomination to the National Park Service where it will receive a final vote sometime later this year. For more information on the Mountain Athletic Club visit,
