They will prepare foods and serve them at the Café and for take away. In addition, they will offer and use specialty items such as a full selection of beans from the Snake River area, a dozen cultivars of rice including wild rice from Minnesota and other specialty products



including often hard to find spices, flours, grains, couscous and cereals.

House specialties include house-roasted nut and trail mixes, soup mixes and spice mixes made with top quality ingredients. They are especially excited to be offering high quality products from New Mexico, a state with its own signature cuisine based on native plants. In addition to the spice mixes, they will offer specialty products such as dried mushrooms, dried peppers, and dried fruits

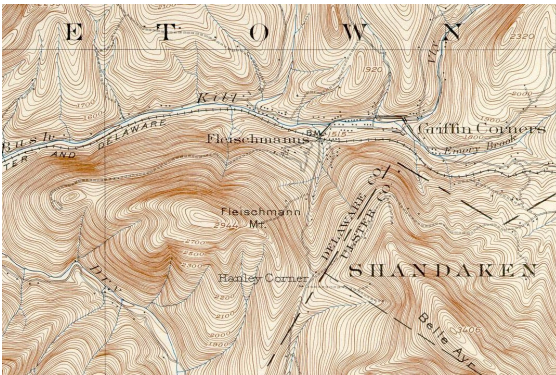
Fleischmanns Labor Day Weekend Street Fair

MUSEUM OF MEMORIES COLLECTION



For 2021, this column will feature a look at efforts to map Fleischmanns and the surrounding region over the last 165 years.

Topographic maps offer a different way to present geographical information. By integrating contour lines and other techniques, they give more information than a simple road map would do. The United States Geological Survey (USGS) has been creating topo maps since 1882. At first, they were made using a 15-minute grid: Basically one inch on the map showed one mile.

The early map of the Fleischmanns area was surveyed in 1901, printed in 1904. (Note: this was before Lake Switzerland was created by the erection of the dam in 1907. Maps were not usually updated, so as late as 1942, this map was being reprinted, still showing no lake.)

After World War II, the maps were redone, using the more detailed 7.5-minute grid, allowing for much more detail. Individual buildings could be shown. Again, the maps are simply reprinted--so even though the dam came down in 2003, today's maps still show Lake Switzerland as being there.

The modern maps are easily found. The earlier series can be found on-line at the University of New Hampshire Library website--they have a great collection of New England and New York State maps.

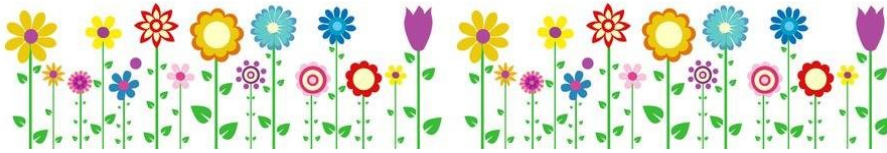
