Fleischmanns Election Results of March 21 Not Certified



Fleischmanns held its election for Mayor and two Trustees on March 21. Elizabeth Hughes, Todd Pascarella and Yvonne Reuter received a majority of the in person votes cast. However, results are incomplete because objections based on residency requirements were made against

81 absentee ballots that have not been counted. The Delaware County Supreme Court has ordered that the election not be certified pending the results of a hearing scheduled to commence on April 3, 2023.

At the spring breakfast, to be held on April 16 at the Arts Inn, Fleischmanns First will unveil a Vision for 17 Public Space to jump-start a 5-year plan to promote civic engagement, tourism, economic development, public health and environmental sustainability for our village.

While public space is the responsibility of local and county government to maintain, the Vision Plan engages the entire community with projects, campaigns and events which engender stewardship of our public land and water. Whether you like to garden, hike, paint, walk your dog, watch birds, party or picnic, there are opportunities to volunteer. Already the Common Ground Garden Club of Delaware County has approved a proposal to enhance the Welcome Garden at the Information Kiosk.

The public space we share includes four gardens, the swimming pool, Wagner Avenue Park with tennis courts, ball fields, the ADA compliant playground, stream access, a waterfall, an orchard, lawns, and the Skene Memorial Library. Imagine each space polished and strung like pearls on a necklace. Now that the new footbridge connects Main Street to Wagner Avenue, all 17 spaces will be linked with signage and self-guided walking/cycling tours so that visitors and residents alike can more fully experience a village steeped in history and on the upswing, offering art, culture, eateries, shops, lodging and recreation.

MUSEUM OF MEMORIES COLLECTION




For 2023, this column will be taking a look at the parts that make up 'greater' Fleischmanns—the area served by zip code 12430, delivered by the Fleischmanns Post Office.


Decades before there was a Griffin's Corners, and almost a century before the incorporation of the Village of Fleischmanns, there were people living and established businesses just to the beginning of the 10th century, the old turnpiles

west of what is today's Village. At the beginning of the 19th century, the old turnpike ran along the stream here, and people and businesses were soon active. There were mills and even a hotel. Clovesville had enough settlers to warrant its own Post Office, which opened in 1824. The church was built in the early 1840's, and has served several different denominations since then.

Since the 1830's, Clovesville has served as the final resting place for many. There are actually 3 separate burial grounds--a small Catholic area on the south side of the road, the main cemetery--with burials dating as far back as 1838, and up above that the Bnai

There is still the old NY State highway sign designating the locality, but the mis-spelling (leaving out the first 'l') was never fixed.
